A new name and a new committee



Welcome to the first edition of our new look newsletter! The Mid Kent Breast Cancer Research Appeal has changed its name to 'Breast Cancer Kent'. With the retirement of founder members Mr and Mrs Jones and their committee in 2013, a new team of Consultants, professionals and volunteers has continued the work of

the original charity. Dedicated to raising money to improve the lives of people diagnosed with breast cancer in Kent, the charity funds projects and equipment for all stages of diagnosis, treatment, survivorship and wellbeing. It also assists in funding study days for the professionals working in the breast units. The charity continues to be run by volunteers who give their time and expertise completely free of charge, and so 100% of all donations, however great or small, go to the charity.

Digital Breast Tomosynthesis (DBT) arrives at Maidstone Breast Clinic



Thanks to the generous donations of many people over the last few years, the charity has been able to afford its biggest acquisition yet.

Digital breast tomosynthesis (or 3-D mammography) has arrived at Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells NHS Trust and has been installed in the Maidstone Breast Clinic.

Digital breast tomosynthesis (DBT), otherwise known as

3-D mammography is a newly developed technology that can increase the detection rate of small breast cancers. This new technique has now been investigated in the UK and several European Breast Units. In the Oslo Tomosynthesis Screening Trial, the addition of DBT increased the invasive cancer detection rate by as much as 40% and showed a 15% decrease in false positive readings.

This is great news for the patients who are screened at the unit and is all thanks to those who've supported the charity so generously.
